Chaplain's Message

In addition to the Church's yearly reminder of the Church Triumphant on All Saints' and the Church Suffering on All Souls', the beginning of November also brings with it a reminder of the anti-Catholicism which used to exist in the English-speaking world – and still does sadly in some quarters of our society. Catholics being looked upon with suspicion and even outright hatred by some is unfortunately not a new reality, nor is our own time the worst. Far from it.

On November 5, 1605, English authorities foiled a foolhardy conspiracy against King James I led by two men named Robert Catesby and Guy Fawkes, though others were involved. The plan was to hide 36 barrels of gunpowder beneath the English Parliament and detonate it while the king was before the House of Lords. Catesby and the others were English Catholics who had lost hope in the efforts of their fellow Catholics to secure their religious freedom. Being a Catholic in England had long been outlawed since 1559 and the accession of King James' mother, Elizabeth I, and the property and even the very life of a Catholic was forfeit to the state depending on the circumstances. Unfortunately for Catesby, Fawkes, and the others, the misguided plot was discovered by government agents. Catesby was killed in the fight which preceded their capture, and Fawkes was publicly hanged, drawn, and quartered – a brutal punishment reserved for treason. It was the more sensational Fawkes who thus became the face of the failed plot.

The 'Fifth of November' was turned into an English – and later British – national holiday, known as 'Bonfire Night.' Poems and songs were written, most beginning famously, "Remember, remember, the fifth of November, Gunpowder Treason and Plot!" Originally, the custom was to make wood and straw effigies of Guy Fawkes and even the Pope (then Pope Clement VIII, who was ironically very against any violence by Catholics in England) for public burning and parade. Much later, an English editor named Titus Oates invented a 'Popish Plot' conspiracy theory which caused huge anti-Catholic riots in London from 1678-1681, all invoking the specter of 1605.

Thus, November 5 became the most visceral symbol of English anti-Catholicism. The plot – and everything that preceded it – was the formation of a culture deeply suspicious and resentful of everything Catholic. The custom even took root in the British colonies in America, where it was known as 'Pope Night.' So popular was it that George Washington ordered that it not be observed by the soldiers of the Continental Army so as not to offend their French Catholic allies.

Bonfire Night lingers on in Britain today. Every so often, one can still spot the Pope or a modern, grotesque take on Guy Fawkes. But it has changed over time. Now, it is much more popular to burn effigies of unpopular politicians than to call up the ghost of 1605. But every year on the 'Fifth of November,' one can still hear the ghost of English bigotry stir. And it reminds us all of the ongoing threat of bigotry and ignorance.


