Chaplain's Message

Advent is a time of many important celebrations of our Lady. Here at St. Leo's, because of the great diversity of our community, we celebrate many of them in style. To wit, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, patron of the United States, our Lady of Guadalupe, patron of the Americas, Lady of Loreto, the nine-day novena of Simbang Gabi Masses, and of course the *Rorate Caeli* Masses, votive Masses of the Blessed Virgin on Saturday, traditionally celebrated by candlelight in early morning. It is such a joy to prepare for Christmas by remembering our Lady and the many ways in which she is our common mother.

One lady who is often left out, however, is St. Lucy, whom we celebrate on December 13. In centuries past, St. Lucy was one of the most popular saints. In Dante's Divine Comedy, the Blessed Virgin sends her to Beatrice, Dante's muse, who in turn sends the poet Vergil to him to begin his cosmic journey. In this, we see the medieval love and devotion to St. Lucy.

Santa Lucia. Her name means 'light.' Dante has her descending from the throne of the Virgin like light out of heaven to enlighten his eyes. In her biography in the *Golden Legend*, she is blessed with great wisdom. Inspired by the great St. Agatha, a native like her of Sicily, she and her mother give away all they have. They see clearly the value of heavenly things above earthly things. When this giving away of their wealth brings the ire of her pagan fiancé, she stands firm, even when he denounces her to the magistrate. The magistrate tries everything to persuade her to apostatize. At one point, like in the story of St. Agnes, he even orders her dragged off to be abused in a brothel so she will lose her treasured chastity, but the Holy Spirit causes her to be immovable, and they cannot lift her. She declares, "It is the work of God, and if thou settest thereto yet ten thousand, they should not move me." They then throw her in a fire, which spectacularly fails to harm her at all. Finally in desperation, they cut her throat.

She is often used in medieval and later literature as a personification or a bearer of heavenly light, the light we need to tell true from false, good from evil. The Swedes famously have the tradition of wearing leafy crowns with lighted candles in them, to symbolize her light in the darkness of winter. Later legend grew up which held that she had put out her own eyes, because her beauty was leading men astray. This is why she is often pictured with her two eyes on a platter. She is consequently the patron of all diseases and disorders of the eyes.
