Deputy Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

As we enter the month of September, we remember the Catholic Church has dedicated September as the Month of the Harvest. Since man is both a spiritual and physical being, the Church provides for the needs of man in his everyday life. The Church's liturgy and feasts in many areas reflect the four seasons of the year (spring, summer, fall and winter). The months of August, September, October and November are part of the harvest season, and as Christians we recall God's constant protection over his people and give thanksgiving for the year's harvest.

The September Ember Days were particularly focused on the end of the harvest season and thanksgiving to God for the season. Ember Days were three days (Wednesday, Friday and Saturday) set aside by the Church for prayer, fasting and almsgiving at the beginning of each of the four seasons of the year. The ember days fell after December 13, the feast of St. Lucy (winter), after the First Sunday of Lent (spring), after Pentecost Sunday (summer), and after September 14, the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, after the Third Sunday of September (autumn). These weeks were known as the *quattor tempora*, the "four seasons."

Since the late 5th century, the Ember Days were also the preferred dates for ordination of priests. So, during these times the Church had a threefold focus: (1) sanctifying each new season by turning to God through prayer, fasting and almsgiving; (2) giving thanks to God for the various harvests of each season; and (3) praying for the newly ordained and for future vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Many thanks to all the Knights who have contributed in any way to our Council this past year, through service or through simple prayers. We are so fortunate through the

Grace of God to have such a strong group of Men dedicated to the ideals of our order, Fraternity, Charity, and Unity.

Special thanks to those who helped with the Alter Server Picnic. Bishop Burbidge expressed much gratitude for the support we provided. For those who assisted with the Rock the Block, it was appreciated!

Chaplain's Message

Every year, on September 14, we celebrate the Exultation of the Holy Cross. It commemorates not only the Crucifixion of our Lord, but also the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem by the Emperor Constantine in 327. It also marks the recapture of the True Cross by the Byzantine Emperor Heraclius in 629 after it was stolen ten years before by the Persians' short-lived capture of Jerusalem. As a result of the fame of the True Cross which came after these events, the feast spread throughout the Christian world, and small fragments of the Cross and other pieces of wood that had been pressed to it gained great fame as relics.

Always in the background of the fame of the True Cross is the story of its rediscovery by St. Helena, the mother of the Emperor Constantine. I recently had the great pleasure of reading Evelyn Waugh's wonderful novel, *Helena* (1950). Waugh was a brilliant and funny British author of the early and mid-twentieth century, who is famous mostly for other books, like *Brideshead Revisited* (1945) and *The Loved One* (1948). He was well known for his grouchy personality and also for being a Catholic convert. When someone asked him how he could be a Catholic with how biting and mean he could sometimes be, he memorably said, "Imagine how much worse I would be if I were not a Catholic!"

Helena is a novel which tells the story of the life of St. Helena amid the high drama and corruption of the late Roman Empire. It is full of biting commentary on failing empires – greed, cruelty, and cynicism. Waugh meant it to throw stones at the then-crumbling British Empire and we can learn something from it now about our own nation's threatened power. In the novel, Helena marries a powerful man, Constantius, Constantine's father, is divorced by him, and cast aside. Over time, she discovers Christianity as the only bright spot in the morass of meaningless corruption and violence which surrounds her. At the end of the book, on fire suddenly with divine inspiration and now knowing her true purpose, she discovers the True Cross, hidden under rubble in Jerusalem. *Helena* was Waugh's favorite novel and the one of which he was most proud.

I recommend the book to all. It is a beautiful way to understand better our reverence and devotion for the Cross as well as the long centuries of Christian tradition which came before us.
